

Green Adventure Project
Covid-19 Mitigation Health Plan



Green Adventure Project will accept up to 40 students for in person instruction, five days the school year starting August 24, 2020. School hours will be 8am to 3pm each day. Class will primarily be held outside with very limited indoor time.

Health & Absenteeism Monitoring:

- Students and staff will be monitored via a daily health check, symptoms questionnaire, and answering CDC recommended questions regarding contact with people who have had confirmed or presumed cases of COVID-19 in the previous two weeks.
- Students will need to answer no to the symptoms questionnaire and no to having had contact with a person who has a confirmed or presumed case in the past two weeks, as well as have a temperature below 100 degrees Fahrenheit prior to exiting their vehicles.
- Temperatures will be recorded each morning.
- If a child or staff member is absent due to health reasons their symptoms will be logged. Students and staff will be asked to be symptom free for a minimum of 24 hours prior to returning to Green Adventure Project.

Communication Strategy:

- All families complete a tour during which COVID-19 policies and procedures are discussed.
- An email with reminders will be sent one week prior to the first day of school, outlining the plan for safety once school resumes.
- The first day of school students will be oriented to policies, reminders will be issued in the following days.
- Monthly newsletters will be sent via email to families and will address any updated policies & procedures.
- If there is a confirmed case at school families will be notified immediately via phone, email or in person.
- Signs will be hung around the school grounds to promote healthy hygiene.

Health Services:

- Medical grade PPE is available for Health Services staff when necessary.
- Access to additional supplies is available.

Education/Training Plan:

- Students and staff will be properly trained on hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette the first day of school, reminders will be issued when necessary.
- Students and staff will maintain 6 feet of physical distance between each another.
- Students and staff will be required to wear face coverings when indoors or when they unable to physically distance.
- Students and staff will be asked to stay home when sick.
- Signs will be hung around the school grounds to promote healthy hygiene.

Executive Order Compliance:

- There will be no field trips during the first year of school.
- The small school size complies with guidelines specific to both phase 2 & 3.
- School will move to a virtual platform in phase 1.

Cleaning & Disinfection

- Spaces will be disinfected using a hospital grade spectracide between groups.
- Spaces will be cleaned daily.
- Hands will be washed or sanitized between activities, before leaving a space, before and after eating, and after coughing or sneezing.
- Any shared items will be sanitized after each use.
- Students will receive labeled supplies for their own personal use.
- Anytime students are indoors fans will be running, when appropriate, based on weather, windows and doors will remain open for air circulation.
- Water lines will be flushed prior to students returning to school if for any reason the school must be closed for a prolonged period of time.
- Heat and air conditioning systems are monitored, and filtration is changed regularly.

Educators

- Green Adventure Project Educators will have their temperatures taken daily. They will be trained to monitor symptoms and communicate proactively. Educators will be asked to remain at home if symptoms of COVID-19 are present.
- If an Educator is sick, Green Adventure Project will have access to substitute Educators from Triple C Camp who will also be screened before any interaction with students.
- Triple C Camp substitutes will be trained in the education policies & procedures of Green Adventure Project.

Health & Safety

- If a student or staff member presents with COVID-19 symptoms they will be separated from their class and given a space to rest.
- Parents will be notified to pick up their student. If the person showing symptoms is a staff member, they will be sent home.
- If there is a confirmed case of COVID-19 Green Adventure Project will contact the Thomas Jefferson Health District for guidance.
- If a student or staff member needs to be transported to the hospital, they will be taken by Triple C Camp staff in a Triple C Camp vehicle.
- Following any contact with a confirmed or presumed case of COVID-19 all surfaces, spaces, and supplies will be properly cleaned and sanitized.
- Green Adventure Project will comply with all guidance set forth by the Thomas Jefferson Health District.
